In her eight years of volunteering at FGHC, Dolores Capocci has helped a lot of clients. But there's one client she's never forgotten. Dolores affectionately refers to her as "the lady with the spoons."

Several years ago, when FGHC distributed not only clothing but also household items, a Hispanic family came to the center. Dolores said they had lost everything in a fire. In addition, the mother broke her leg in the midst of the chaos.

Dolores gave the family dishes, pots and pans, utensils, towels, bedding, and more.

"They were in awe of how much I was able to give them," she said.

Before they left, the mother said something in Spanish. Her son (translating) said, "My mother wants to know if she can have a large spoon." Dolores showed her two serving spoons, one with slots and one without. She took the one without the slots. Dolores told her son she could have both.

"She kept trying to give me back the slotted spoon.," Dolores said. "I told her 'it's okay, you can have both.' When her son told her, she started crying and hugged me."

Ever since then, whenever she's having a bad day, Dolores remembers the "lady with the spoons."

"I realize I don't have it so bad," she says.

Growing up in Milwaukee, Dolores attended St. Thomas Aquinas grade school. Fr. Gerald McAdams, the pastor at St. Thomas Aquinas, was good friends with FGHC founder, Fr. Gene Jakubek. Fr. Gene would visit the school often.

"Me and my friend would run up to Fr. Gene whenever we'd see him with Fr. Gerald," Dolores said.

What she remembers most about Fr. Gene after all these years is his kindness.

"He had such a warm smile." she said.

Through the years Dolores supported FGHC by donating clothing but she didn't start volunteering until eight years ago, after seeing a notice in her church bulletin. She stopped by the center to donate clothing and asked one of the volunteers about volunteering. He took her to Deacon Don who asked her when she could start.

"I started volunteering the next day and I've been volunteering ever since," she said.
